



To commemorate the attack and to honor our heritage the following events have been scheduled:

- On May 17 at 7:00 PM, A Symposium on the 1918 Attack will be held at Snow Library. Local historians from the Historical Commission, Historical Society, and the French Cable Station will discuss the attack, its context, and its significance. We will also present a view of what Orleans was like in 1918.
- On July 10 the above Symposium will repeat at the Federated Church during a Chowder Supper from 5:00 PM - 7:00 P
- On July 12 at 7:00 PM, the above Symposium will repeat at Snow Library.
- On July 19 at 7:00 PM, Jake Klim, author of Attack on Orleans (History Press 2014) will speak at the Orleans Historical Society. Klim's book provides a carefully researched chronical of the attack and the resilience of the Orleans citizens.
- On July 20 at 7:00 PM, Paul Hodos, author of The Kaiser's Lost Kreuzer (McFarland and Co. 2018) will speak at the Orleans Historical Society. Hodos's book is a meticulously researched biography of the U-156 and sheds considerable light on the long standing unanswered questions on what the sub's intention was on July 21.
- On July 21 at 5:00 PM, a Centennial Commemoration Ceremony will be held at Nauset Beach. The Nauset Sea Scout Ship 72 will display a Race Point Surfboat with oars on a trailer with scouts in uniforms.
- On July 22 at 3:00 PM, the Orleans Historical Society will hold an Illustrated talk: "American Popular Music during World War I" – John Graziano, Professor Emeritus of Music, CCNY.
